General information

International Security and Development (ISAD) is an international MA programme of studies addressed to students from all over the world who are interested in security and development issues. The programme provides not only theoretical, but also practical knowledge, as Polish and international academic staff and practitioners are part of our team. ISAD aims to foster creative thinking about complex problems of global security and development, as well as to equip students with the requisite analytical tools, language expertise, and cross-cultural understanding. It also helps graduates obtain professional skills needed for managing global security and development in an international environment. During the whole two-year programme, six scholarships are available for the top students. There are three partial fee waiver scholarships at the first year of studies for three students at the top of the recruitment list, and another three partial fee waiver scholarships in the second year for three students at the top of the list based on academic merit (GPA).



Academic Tracks

International Security

The aim of this academic track is to extend knowledge of the causes of contemporary conflicts and crisis response based on the analysis of empirical cases, as well as intercultural communication including varying regional conditions in different parts of the world (Africa, Asia, the Middle East, and Latin America). The studies include the analysis of non-traditional threats (hybrid warfare, cyberterrorism, the spread of international terrorist and criminal networks, energy security, climate protection) and conflict management, peace building on many levels.

International Development

This academic track provides knowledge of the difficulties faced by governments, international institutions, aid agencies, and NGOs in the case of conflicts, humanitarian crises, poverty challenges, post-conflict reconstruction etc. We focus on gaining basic skills within planning, designing, conducting and managing aid policies. The studies also include challenges associated with development effectiveness and human security.

Programme structure

The courses and modules are divided into two major categories: the mandatory modules prevailing in the first two semesters will give you a solid foundation in security and development studies. Academic track courses taught in the third and fourth semesters will provide more focused knowledge and competence in your chosen area. Apart from these, there are a number of optional courses offered every year. Additionally, we offer a language course in one of the following languages: German, French, and Polish, and other languages may also be available. As a two year programme, ISAD is divided into four semesters and students need to complete modules worth at least 60 ECTS credits each year and 120 ECTS in total.

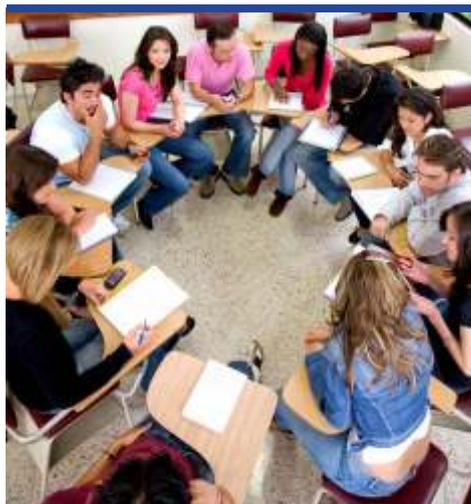
Why Poland?

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Entry requirements

Persons eligible to apply for the programme are holders of a higher education diploma (at least undergraduate) in any field.

An additional formal requirement is a documented command of English that is at least at the B2 level specified by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. At the same time, we accept a number of recognized language certificates. English native speakers or graduates from study programmes where English was the language of instruction are exempted from this requirement.

Candidates are placed on a ranking list, expressed on a scale from 0 to 100, calculated as follows:

- Assessment of a motivation letter written in English (a preliminary thesis project will also be assessed as a part of the motivation letter) - maximum of 50 points;
- Points awarded for reference letters - maximum of 50 points.

Fees

The tuition fee for the programme is 4000 EUR per annum (8000 EUR for the full two-year programme).
